We invite applications for a full-time assistant professor position (tenure-track). We are looking for candidates with an expertise **in Indigenous public and community sector administration, policy, governance, or community development**. The preferred start date is July 1, 2019.

The School of Public Administration is dedicated to educating public sector and community leaders who are able to effectively navigate complex settings. We contribute to the development of innovative thinkers and professionals who will have a positive impact on governments and communities through their commitments to the values of democracy, engaged and courageous scholarship, sustainability and inclusivity.

The School of Public Administration offers multi-disciplinary programs for practicing or prospective leaders, managers and analysts seeking the skills necessary for effective and responsible public management and policy analysis. We offer five undergraduate Professional Specialization Certificates and three Diplomas, as well as graduate-level Master's degrees in Public Administration (MPA) and Community Development (MA), a Graduate Certificate and Diploma in Evaluation, and a PhD in Public Administration. Limited hire: In accordance with the University's Equity Plan and pursuant to Section 42 of the BC Human Rights Code, the selection will be limited to Indigenous peoples. Candidates from this group must self-identify.

Requirements

Candidates for the appointment should hold a Ph.D., or have a fixed dissertation defense date within three months of commencement of the position, in a relevant field with specific expertise in Indigenous public and community sector administration, policy, governance, and development. Post-doctoral training is an asset. Candidates must have teaching experience and a promising research program.

We are interested in recruiting a person who collaborates well and is interested in making a difference in her/his academic and community environments through teaching, research, and university and community service. The successful candidate will be expected to teach in the graduate and undergraduate programs, in both online and on campus formats, supervise graduate students, conduct research and participate in the administrative structure of the School.

Application Procedure

Applications should be provided as a complete package and must include: (1) a cover letter reviewing the candidate's qualifications, experience, research plans, teaching expertise and demonstration of engaged scholarship, and including a statement of self-identification as an Indigenous person; (2) an up-to-date curriculum vitae; (3) course evaluations if applicable; (4) a single article-length sample of the candidate's scholarly work ; and (5) the names of three referees who could be contacted if the candidate is short-listed.
